

## Context

Satellite Earth Observation (EO) provides a wide range of different types of environmental information that are global, comprehensive, accurate, repeatable and timely, and that are key to the effective planning and implementation of development assistance activities. Since 2008, ESA has been working with various International Financial Institutions (IFIs)—including World Bank—on the Earth Observation for Sustainable Development (E04SD) initiative.

EO4SD is now evolving into a new phase from 2020-2025 called Space for International Development **Assistance**. That initiative will be implemented in a joint, coordinated programme of work between ESA and newly-established Trust Funds at World Bank and Asian Development Bank (ADB). It will

"realise the full potential impact of environmental information from satellites in addressing core development challenges through transfer and mainstreaming into development assistance operations, activities and financing".

Within this context, the final thematic cluster of EO4SD projects, E04SD-Forest Management launched in September 2020.







## **E04SD-Forest Management Goal**

Demonstrate the utility of mainstreaming satellite **Earth Observation (EO)**-based forest related products and services for improved Forest Management for IFI programmes and stakeholders in Client States (CS).

To assist IFIs and Client States with better understanding of the technology, its costs and **sustainability** in order to identify opportunities for its integration into IFI-funded initiatives and policy-making activities.





## **Specific Objectives**

- To offer convincing demonstrations of the benefit and utility of EO-based information in the Forest Management theme.
- To provide the services on a national and regional basis in specific countries in Latin America, South East Asia, Middle East and North Africa (MENA) and sub-Saharan Africa.
- To ensure that the products and services are user-driven:
- → To agree on priority products and services with the IFIs in relation to their regional programmes.
- → To implement the project with a strong stakeholder engagement in order to validate the utility of the EO products and services.
- To generate an operational forest management portfolio offering quality controlled EO products.
- To facilitate technology transfer via capacity building exercises in the different regions.
